

**CHEMICALS:** REVEAL use at 1:10

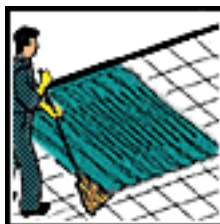
**EQUIPMENT:**

Personal Protective Equipment  
Tape  
Wet Floor Signs  
Dust Mop  
Putty Knife or Edging Tool  
2 Mop Buckets with Wringers  
Cotton Mop to apply cleaner

Clean cotton mop for rinse  
Rotary Floor Machine -Low Speed  
Blue Cleaning Pads  
Broom & Dust Pan  
Wet Pick-up Vacuum  
Burnishing machine & Pads  
Wiping Cloths

**PROCEDURES:**

STEPS	KEY POINTS
1. Assemble equipment.	1. See above.
2. Remove any free-standing objects from the floor. Vacuum or clean the walk-off mats and set aside.	2. Place "Caution-Wet Floor" signs at the end of each area. Place walk-off mat at exit area.
3. Remove gum and other material with putty knife.	3. Deposit in waste receptacle.
4. Dust mop entire floor and remove all dry soil.	4. Work toward ends of aisles, pick up with dust pan and broom.
5. Wearing appropriate safety equipment according to product label directions.	5. Local site OH&S requirements may require specific chemical handling.
6. Mix cleaner per label dilution. <b>Note:</b> Add chemical to water and never leave chemicals unattended.	6. Do not use hot water or film will be softened causing dirt embedment
7. Using mop and bucket apply cleaner liberally to the floor.	7. Areas may require Taping to prevent cleaner migration.
8. Use edging tool to clean close to baseboards and in corners.	8. Attention is required in any areas inaccessible to machine.



9. Scub floor with single disk floor machine and blue cleaning pad.



9. Make slow overlapping passes with machine. Change pads and rinse as they become full for reuse. Pay particular attention to areas already heavily soiled.

10. After scrubbing, pick up cleaner solution with a wet vacuum or mop & bucket.



10. Work from dry area to wet and away from vacuum to avoid tangling cord.

11. Apply rinse water with clean rinse mop. Pick up rinse water with a wet vacuum or clean mop.



11. Do not use Hot water or damage to the polish could result.

12. With fresh water, Wring rinse mop dry and mop over the floor.

12. Make sure to mop over areas that are streaked from wet vacuum.

13. Allow floor to dry to touch.

14. Check for powder residue on the floor with palm of hand.



13. Check for any dirt spots that will show through the recoat. Repeat steps 7 - 14 on any spots not completely cleaned.

14. White powder on palm indicates insufficient rinsing. Repeat steps 11 - 14 again.

15. Burnish the cleaned floor with an appropriate pad.



15. Burnishing the floor prior to recoat will result in an improved result.

16. Dust mop entire floor and remove all dry soil.

16. Work toward ends of aisles, pick up with dust pan and broom.

17. Clean all equipment and return to its appropriate area. Remove wet floor signs.



17. Equipment in good clean working order improves the quality of the result.
